A DEVOTIONAL FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY

Advent:

This devotional is designed for us to walk through the Advent and Christmastide season together, in community. By definition, Advent means the arrival of something, or someone, important. It is fitting, therefore, that we spend ample time to prepare our entire being for the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ. While God created the world and humanity and declared them both very good, the willful rebellion of Adam and Eve brought sin and destruction. This sin devastates the entire world and impacts everyone. While many in our culture will try to numb themselves to the devastation of sin with the lure of material gifts, this season is really about God's faithful work to redeem his creation. It is also about embracing the tension we experience as redeemed people in a fallen world, looking forward to the day when Jesus comes again! The weekly themes for Advent will engage the biblical story, honing in on our longing for God's saving work, the hope found in God's promises, and our preparation for the coming of Jesus.

Christmastide:

While many celebrate Christmas for one or two days before quickly shifting their focus to New Year's, the Church spends 12 days in a season known as Christmastide. Following the preparation of Advent, Christmastide is a time of joyfully praising God for sending his Son to earth. As people who live in a fast-paced, hyper-scheduled society, spending an extended time celebrating the coming of Jesus might seem strange to us. That is exactly why this season is so important. By taking time to ponder God's amazing work and praising God for his steadfast love and grace, we will realize that worship should be the undergirding theme of our lives. The weekly themes for Christmastide are joy and mission: leading us to praise God with unbridled joy, and then going into the world to proclaim the work of Jesus, the Savior of that world!

HOW TO USE THIS DEVOTIONAL

Read through this brief guide so you are familiar with how to use each part of this devotional as we walk through Advent and Christmastide together.

Invitation/Blessing:

This is a short segment of Scripture that coincides with each of the weekly themes. Use it as a prayerful introduction to prepare your heart for time in God's Word, and as a word of hope and blessing as you go into your day. (Note: all Scripture is from the ESV.)

Daily Scripture Readings:

The passages selected for each day follow the redemptive narrative in Scripture, which anticipates the coming of Jesus. Read these once, then look to the Dwelling for further meditation.

Dwelling:

Follow these rotating instructions to slow down, engaging with the daily Scripture reading in a way that drives you to the Lord in prayer.

Guided Prayers:

These prompts flow from the weekly themes and daily Scripture readings. They can be used for both private and corporate prayer in your homes.

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Confessional Prayers:

These prayers are based on historic confessions of the Church and were written by members of Green Lake Presbyterian Church. The intent of these prayers is for you to engage with the Church, both past and present, as we anticipate and celebrate the coming of our Lord and Savior. Sundays:

Since our journey through Advent is both a communal and individual experience, there are no daily devotionals assigned for Sundays. Corporate worship with your local church serves as the devotional for the day. While at church, consider striking up a conversation with someone about what God has been teaching you during this season. Please note that the very first day of Advent this year is a Sunday, so there will not be a devotional for that day.

Week 1: Longing

ADVENT DAY 2: MON, DEC 4

Invitation - Psalm 130:5

I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope.

Scripture Reading - Genesis 1:1, 26-2:1a

In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. And God blessed them. And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth." And God said, "Behold, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is on the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit. You shall have them for food. And to every beast of the earth and to every bird of the heavens and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the breath of life, I have given every green plant for food." And it was so. And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day. Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them.

Dwelling

Humble yourself before God. Read again, out loud if possible. Which words or phrases are particularly striking? What do they reveal about God? What do they reveal about us? Respond to God accordingly, resting in Him.

Guided Prayer

- Praise God for the goodness of all creation.
- Confess how you might not care for God's creation.
- Ask God for the eyes to see the inherent goodness in all that he has made.

Confessional Prayer - WSC 9 & 10

Lord, it is an amazing, even inconceivable, reality that you created all things out of nothing. We praise you for your infinite power and your abundant care in creating a world that is not only complex, but is truly beautiful. Our hearts delight in how you have made us in your image and likeness! Restore us to the goodness that you intended for all creation. Amen.

Blessing - Psalm 130:7-8



ADVENT DAY 3: TUE, DEC 5

Invitation - Psalm 130:5

I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope.

Scripture Reading - Genesis 3:1-7

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the Lord God had made.

He said to the woman, "Did God actually say, 'You shall not eat of any tree in the garden?" And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die." But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die. For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate. Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked. And they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loincloths.

Dwelling

Thank and praise God for revealing himself to you. Read again, slowly this time. Ask the Holy Spirit to direct your prayers through the Word, leading you into a faithful and devoted response.

Guided Prayer

- Grieve over our willful rebellion against God and the shame it has brought into our lives.
- Confess how we continually fall into the temptation to take matters into our own hands.
- Ask for God's mercy and forgiveness.

Confessional Prayer - WSC 16 & 17

Righteous and Holy Lord, though you made all creation good, the sin of our forebearers, Adam and Eve, brought death, destruction, and misery. And we are not innocent in this, but stand guilty of this transgression. We are faithless, but you are forever faithful. Grant us your forgiveness for the sake of Christ and his blood. Amen.

Blessing - Psalm 130:7-8

ADVENT DAY 4: WED, DEC 6

Invitation - Psalm 130:5

I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope.

Scripture Reading - Genesis 3:16-19

To the woman he said,

"I will surely multiply your pain in childbearing; in pain you shall bring forth children.

Your desire shall be contrary to your husband, but he shall rule over you."

And to Adam he said,

"Because you have listened to the voice of your wife and have eaten of the tree of which I commanded you, 'You shall not eat of it,' cursed is the ground because of you; in pain you shall eat of it all the days of your life; thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you; and you shall eat the plants of the field. By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread, till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; for you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Dwelling

What does this passage awaken in you? Stop and ask God about the response this passage has caused in you. Ask him to help you as you explore your emotions, doubts, concerns, and fears. Let God's Holy Spirit assure you of the truth.

Guided Prayer

- · Grieve over the perversion of creation.
- Confess ways our sin emboldens the curse upon creation.
- Ask for God's healing in this world.

Confessional Prayer - WSC 18 & 19

You are the source of all that is right and true, yet our eyes turn to the broken wisdom of this world. We avoid the gaze of your judgment upon us; we choose false hope and false promises. You call creation out of chaos; you are the great Redeemer. By your voice this universe was created and it is only in your voice that we are brought to safety. Amen.

Blessing - Psalm 130:7-8



ADVENT DAY 5: THUR, DEC 7

Invitation - Psalm 130:5

I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope.

Scripture Reading - 1 Samuel 8:4-9

Then all the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at Ramah and said to him, "Behold, you are old and your sons do not walk in your ways. Now appoint for us a king to judge us like all the nations." But the thing displeased Samuel when they said, "Give us a king to judge us." And Samuel prayed to the Lord. And the Lord said to Samuel, "Obey the voice of the people in all that they say to you, for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being king over them. According to all the deeds that they have done, from the day I brought them up out of Egypt even to this day, forsaking me and serving other gods, so they are also doing to you. Now then, obey their voice; only you shall solemnly warn them and show them the ways of the king who shall reign over them."

Dwelling

Pause and remind yourself that God is a Father who loves and instructs his children. Ask God what he might be teaching you through his Word. How might God be stirring your heart to respond to him today?

Guided Prayer

- Grieve that the ways of the world are not God's ways.
- Confess how we give in to the temptation to be like the world.
- Cry out to God for him to reign over the world and our lives.

Confessional Prayer - WLC 45

Just as the Israelites were fickle and demanding, so are we. Please forgive us. Help us to trust in your plan, one which has shown us the greatest goodness in Jesus coming to the world. He has made us full citizens in his Kingdom. More than that, he has made us family. Praise be to God for the King of kings! Amen.

Blessing - Psalm 130:7-8

ADVENT DAY 6: FRI, DEC 8

Invitation - Psalm 130:5

I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope.

Scripture Reading -

1 Samuel 15:10-13, 24-29

The word of the Lord came to Samuel: "I regret that I have made Saul king, for he has turned back from following me and has not performed my commandments." And Samuel was angry, and he cried to the Lord all night. And Samuel rose early to meet Saul in the morning. And it was told Samuel, "Saul came to Carmel, and behold, he set up a monument for himself and turned and passed on and went down to Gilgal." And Samuel came to Saul, and Saul said to him, "Blessed be you to the Lord. I have performed the commandment of the Lord." Saul said to Samuel, "I have sinned, for I have transgressed the commandment of the Lord and your words, because I feared the people and obeyed their voice. Now therefore, please pardon my sin and return with me that I may bow before the Lord." And Samuel said to Saul, "I will not return with you. For you have rejected the word of the Lord, and the Lord has rejected you from being king over Israel." As Samuel turned to go away, Saul seized the skirt of his robe, and it tore. And Samuel said to him, "The Lord has torn the kingdom of Israel from you this day and has given it to a neighbor of yours, who is better than you. And also the Glory of Israel will not lie or have regret, for he is not a man, that he should have regret."

Dwelling

Humble yourself before God. Read again, out loud if possible. Which words or phrases are particularly striking? What do they reveal about God? About us? Respond to God accordingly, resting in Him.

Guided Prayer

- Grieve over the many ways the world has rejected God.
- Confess how, at times, we don't even want to obey God.
- Ask God to cultivate in us a desire and yearning to obey his good commands.

Confessional Prayer - WLC 45

Lord Christ, you are the perfect King, and it is our good to obey you; yet we consistently choose our own way. But you have wondrously called us to yourself; give us now grace to obey you, to seek you, to wait for you, to humbly submit to your correction, to overcome temptation, to endure suffering, and this for the sake of your glory and our good. Amen.

Blessing - Psalm 130:7-8



ADVENT DAY 7: SAT, DEC 9

Invitation - Psalm 130:5

I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope.

Scripture Reading - 2 Samuel 12:7b-14

"Thus says the Lord, the God of Israel, 'I anointed you king over Israel, and I delivered you out of the hand of Saul. And I gave you your master's house and your master's wives into your arms and gave you the house of Israel and of Judah. And if this were too little, I would add to you as much more. Why have you despised the word of the Lord, to do what is evil in his sight? You have struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword and have taken his wife to be your wife and have killed him with the sword of the Ammonites. Now therefore the sword shall never depart from your house, because you have despised me and have taken the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be your wife.' Thus says the Lord, 'Behold, I will raise up evil against you out of your own house. And I will take your wives before your eyes and give them to your neighbor, and he shall lie with your wives in the sight of this sun. For you did it secretly, but I will do this thing before all Israel and before the sun." David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the Lord." And Nathan said to David, "The Lord also has put away your sin; you shall not die. Nevertheless, because by this deed you have utterly scorned the Lord, the child who is born to you shall die."

Dwelling

Thank and praise God for revealing himself to you. Read again, slowly this time. Ask the Holy Spirit to direct your prayers through the Word, leading you into a faithful and devoted response.

Guided Prayer

- Lament sin's power in this world and its consequences.
- Confess the stubbornness of our hearts and our desire to justify sin.
- · Ask God to help us overcome sin in our lives.

Confessional Prayer - WLC 45

LORD Jesus, you are a perfect King. Unlike any human ruler, when you accomplish glory for yourself, we are safe and blessed. You use your power to protect us, to cause us to flourish. Our enemies are no match for you! No oppression will stand forever. You break down the strongholds of sin in our lives and bring justice for the sin done against us. King of Glory, work in our lives and order them as you will. Amen.

Week 2: Hope

ADVENT DAY 9: MON, DEC 11

Invitation - Isaiah 9:2

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone.

Scripture Reading - Genesis 3:14-15

The Lord God said to the serpent,

"Because you have done this, cursed are you above all livestock and above all beasts of the field; on your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel."

Dwelling

What does this passage awaken in you? Stop and ask God about the response this passage has caused in you. Ask him to help you as you explore your emotions, doubts, concerns, and fears. Let God's Holy Spirit assure you of the truth.

Guided Prayer

- Look forward in hope to the offspring that will bruise the serpent's head.
- Express gratitude for God's promise amidst our rebellion.

Confessional Prayer - BHC 17

LORD God.

When we had rejected your wisdom, taken our lives in our own hands, and run from you in fear, you sought us out. In your divine wisdom, you confronted us with truth. In your divine goodness, you comforted us with the hope of triumph over our deceiver. LORD, you truly are abounding in steadfast love, and it is marvelous in our eyes. Amen.

Blessing - Lamentations 3:22-24

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. "The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him."



ADVENT DAY 10: TUE, DEC 12

Invitation - Isaiah 9:2

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone.

Scripture Reading - Genesis 8:1, 9:7-17

But God remembered Noah and all the beasts and all the livestock that were with him in the ark. And God made a wind blow over the earth, and the waters subsided. And God blessed Noah and his sons and said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, increase greatly on the earth and multiply in it." Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, "Behold, I establish my covenant with you and your offspring after you, and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the livestock, and every beast of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark; it is for every beast of the earth. I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of the flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth." And God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh. And the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on

the earth." God said to Noah, "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth."

Dwelling

Pause and remind yourself that God is a Father who loves and instructs his children. Ask God what he might be teaching you through his Word. How might God be stirring your heart to respond to him today?

Guided Prayer

- Voice gratitude for God's commitment to his creation
- Consider ways to pursue stewardship and care for God's creation.

Confessional Prayer - HC 27

Father, we thank you that you govern all things, from the hearts of kings to the breezes of the wind. Help us to be content whether your fatherly hand brings plenty or hunger, abundance or need, and enable us to be fruitful stewards of the resources you provide. Amen.

Blessing - Lamentations 3:22-24

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. "The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him."

ADVENT DAY 11: WED, DEC 13

Invitation - Isaiah 9:2

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone.

Scripture Reading - Genesis 12:1-3

Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

Dwelling

Humble yourself before God. Read again, out loud if possible. Which words or phrases are particularly striking? What do they reveal about God? About us? Respond to God accordingly, resting in Him.

Guided Prayer

- Express gratitude for how God has been faithful to his promise to Abraham, both in the world and in your life.
- Look forward to all the families of the earth being blessed through God's people.

Confessional Prayer - CD 2.5

Lord Jesus, we can hardly take in the truth that because you took on our humanity we will one day stand before you shoulder to shoulder with people from every tribe and language and nation to worship you, the Lamb and King of kings. For the sake of your Name, fill our hearts with hope, make our lives radiant with your beauty, free us to love and declare your glory to our families, friends, coworkers, and neighbors that they will one day join with all the redeemed to sing your praises. Amen.

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. "The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him."



ADVENT DAY 12: THUR, DEC 14

Invitation - Isaiah 9:2

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone.

Scripture Reading - 2 Samuel 7:8-9, 12-16

Now, therefore, thus you shall say to my servant David, "Thus says the Lord of hosts, I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, that you should be prince over my people Israel. And I have been with you wherever you went and have cut off all your enemies from before you. And I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. When your days are fulfilled and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son. When he commits iniquity, I will discipline him with the rod of men, with the stripes of the sons of men, but my steadfast love will not depart from him, as I took it from Saul, whom I put away from before you. And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me. Your throne shall be established forever."

Dwelling

Thank and praise God for revealing himself to you. Read again, slowly this time. Ask the Holy Spirit to direct your prayers through the Word, leading you into a faithful and devoted response.

Guided Prayer

- Recall that God has established a Kingdom that is greater than the kingdoms of man.
- Look forward to the rightful King sitting on his throne.

Confessional Prayer - WLC 45

King Jesus, Son of David: We eagerly await the full realization of your good and gracious rule. Even now we ask that you rule in our hearts, in our church. Teach us to walk in your ways that we might display the goodness of your governance. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done. Amen.

Blessing - Lamentations 3:22-24

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. "The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him."

Invitation - Isaiah 9:2

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone.

Scripture Reading - Isaiah 9:3-7

You have multiplied the nation; you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as they are glad when they divide the spoil. For the yoke of his burden, and the staff for his shoulder, the rod of his oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. For every boot of the tramping warrior in battle tumult and every garment rolled in blood will be burned as fuel for the fire. For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this.

Dwelling

What does this passage awaken in you? Stop and ask God about the response this passage has caused in you. Ask him to help you as you explore your emotions, doubts, concerns, and fears. Let God's Holy Spirit assure you of the truth.

Guided Prayer

- · Yearn for the light of God to shine in this broken world and in our lives.
- · Praise the Lord for his zeal both to redeem and reign.

Confessional Prayer - NCC 21 & 23

Eternal Savior, at the coming of your birth, hope entered the world. You are the one and only God-man, fully God yet fully man. It is only by your unique personhood that hope and salvation are made possible to your brothers and sisters. Enliven hope in our hearts and make us instruments to display that hope to the world. Amen.

Blessing - Lamentations 3:22-24

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. "The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him."



ADVENT DAY 14: SAT, DEC 16

Invitation - Isaiah 9:2

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone.

Scripture Reading - Jeremiah 31:31-34

"Behold, the days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah, not like the covenant that I made with their fathers on the day when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, my covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, declares the Lord. For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, declares the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts. And I will be their God, and they shall be my people. And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the Lord. For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."

Dwelling

Pause and remind yourself that God is a Father who loves and instructs his children. Ask God what he might be teaching you through his Word. How might God be stirring your heart to respond to him today?

Guided Prayer

- Long for God's law of life to be written on our hearts.
- Express gratitude that God will forgive our iniquity and forget our sins.
- Find hope in the truth that God is actively working to draw people to know him.

Confessional Prayer - NCC 7 & 34

Holy God, by nature our hearts are rebellious and seek to establish our own rules for life; yet such things prove only to lead to death. Grant us a love for your law—your righteous instruction to your people—that it may be a lamp for our feet and a light to our path. Amen.

Blessing - Lamentations 3:22-24

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. "The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him."

Week 3: Preparation

ADVENT DAY 16: MON, DEC 18

Invitation - Isaiah 40:3

A voice cries: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God."

Scripture Reading - Psalm 89:1-4, 34-37

I will sing of the steadfast love of the Lord, forever; with my mouth I will make known your faithfulness to all generations. For I said, "Steadfast love will be built up forever; in the heavens you will establish your faithfulness." You have said, "I have made a covenant with my chosen one; I have sworn to David my servant: 'I will establish your offspring forever, and build your throne for all generations." I will not violate my covenant or alter the word that went forth from my lips. Once for all I have sworn by my holiness; I will not lie to David. His offspring shall endure forever, his throne as long as the sun before me. Like the moon it shall be established forever, a faithful witness in the skies."

Dwelling

So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Dwelling

Humble yourself before God. Read again, out loud if possible. Which words or phrases are particularly striking? What do they reveal about God? About us? Respond to God accordingly, resting in Him.

Guided Prayer

- Find courage in Jesus, who humbled himself to death to save the world.
- Grant us dispositions of humility, actively seeking the interests of God and others.

Confessional Prayer - WSC 27 & 28

Lord Jesus, we stand amazed at the depths of humiliation you took upon yourself on our behalf. You were born as a human, undergoing the miseries of this life, culminating in the receiving of God's wrath as you died on a cross only to triumphantly rise again! May we see you as you are, risen from the dead and exalted, sitting at the right hand of the Father. Amen.

Blessing - Revelation 7:17

Invitation - Isaiah 60:1

Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you.

Scripture Reading - Revelation 7:9-12

Thank and praise God for revealing himself to you. Read again, slowly this time. Ask the Holy Spirit to direct your prayers through the Word, leading you into a faithful and devoted response.

Guided Prayer

- Long for the day when a great multitude will praise our Lord and Savior.
- Seek for a heart that longs for the day when all nations will praise Jesus.

Confessional Prayer - NCC 52

Gracious Lord, thank you for providing us with hope through everlasting life. Help us to live as your redeemed people now, as we look forward to the new heaven and new earth, where we will be freed from sin and live with glorified bodies in a renewed and restored creation. Amen.

Blessing - Revelation 7:17

For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of living water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.
